Medical care is important,

whether or not you decide to report to law enforcement. There is no charge for people seeking medical attention as a result of sexual assault. Insurance will not be billed.

Maintain as much evidence as possible.

Avoid washing, wiping, douching, drinking or changing clothes. Bring a change of clothes to the hospital.

If a friend turns to you for support,

encourage him or her to consider these choices. Be sure to protect the person's identity and allow him or her to make his or her own decisions about how to proceed.

Sexual assault is never the victim's fault.

Alcohol, drugs, dress & behavior are not excuses for sexual assault. A victim of acquaintance assault or 'date rape' is as much a victim as a person assaulted by a stranger.
